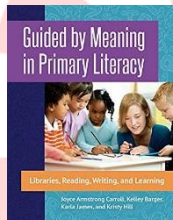




discussion. It deals with how teachers may become more aware of what they are saying and in better control of framing responses and questions in the art of interactive teaching.

This book brings all of the components of literacy together in a meaningful way. This book increase teachers' effectiveness in working with young children to promote early literacy. Throughout the book, the authors highlight examples of student writing, anecdotes from the real world, and connections between theory and what happens in practical application (e.g. read aloud, mini lessons, modeling, guided practice, response, graphic organizers, writing process).
