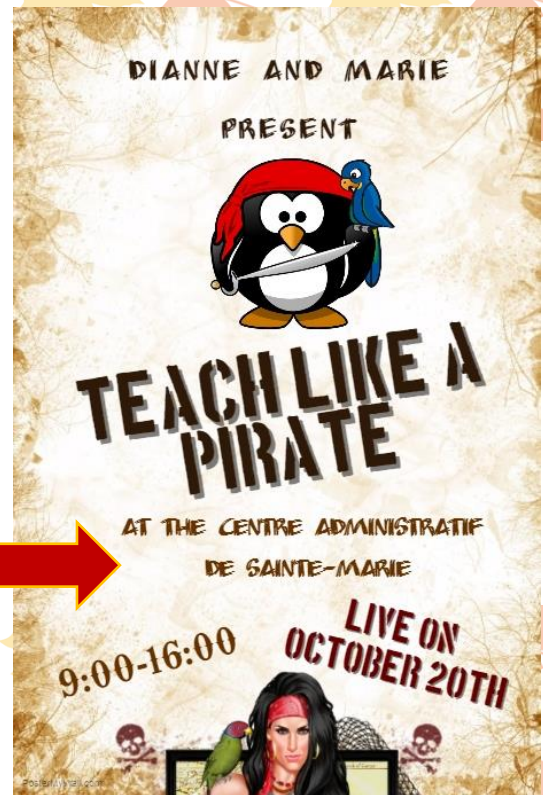
I Love English
